Position Description

Habitat stewards actively work to maintain the diverse ecosystems within CNP, from controlling invasive species to monitoring native habitats.

Duties

- Identify and remove invasive species.
- Install and monitor habitat boxes.
- Conduct periodic habitat health assessments.
- Assist with habitat restoration projects.
- Maintain and repair existing habitat structures.

Requirements

- A keen interest in ecology and habitat preservation.
- Complete a background check.
- Attend CNP New Volunteer Orientation and habitat management training with the program coordinator.
- Be knowledgeable about CNP habitats and communicate effectively with visitors.
- Wear the issued volunteer badge while on duty.
- Report volunteer service hours through the online reporting system.

Time Commitment

- Commit to at least 12 volunteer hours annually.
- Flexible shifts based on volunteer availability.

- Work closely with nature and deepen your ecological knowledge.

2. Brief interview with our team

3. Background Check

All volunteers are subject to a background check. Our background check partner, Checkr, will send you a link to submit information. Please help us offset the cost of the check by making a \$22.99 donation.

4. Orientation

All volunteers will participate in our brief, virtual orientation to familiarize themselves with the Preserve's history, our policies and procedures, and our volunteer tracking software.

5. Program-specific Training

In addition to a general volunteer orientation, volunteers receive hands-on training for their specific role. Your program supervisor will coordinate your training.
